

YOU can risk a £400 fine all for the sake of a jug of water. And police are watching out for you.

The offence: Failing to keep windscreen wipers and washers in

working order.

At this time of year, when roads are dirty and wet, or covered with slush, this offence becomes more prevalent.

A police spokesman said: "When our patrols stop a vehicle for any reason, they check the windscreen.

"If it is smeared or murky it's a give-away. Either the wiper blades are worn out or the washer bottle is empty—and both are offences.

"Motorists don't realise that driving in these conditions is like being partly blindfolded. And it's not always older cars that are at fault.

"Owners of new cars forget to check and refill the washer bottle in

dirty driving conditions."

Another point, which drivers overlook in winter, is that water in the screenwasher reservoir is just as likely to freeze as that in the radiator and engine—unless it has an antifreeze additive.

You may resent paying for a screenwash additive, but refusing to do so can be penny wise and pound foolish.

Do NOT use radiator antifreeze for this will damage the paintwork and will smear your screen.

Should screenwasher nozzles become blocked they can be cleared with fuse wire or a needle.





Eula, 93, pats her 56-year-old pride and joy


Old faithfuls


