

The Committee wish you all a Merry Christmas, and a Very Happy New Year.



## Super charge for Bugatti

THE famous London auctioneers Sotheby's confessed they were amazed when something looking like a tea-towel reached £260, and a dozen 3in. brass hinges fetched £1,400 at a Monte Carlo auction. But they carried a special monogram-"E.B." The two lots were part of a collection of memorabilia from the family of Ettore Bugatti, the famous motor car designer and manufacturer who died 30 years ago. Though best known for his cars, Bugatti was also a sport and boat fanatic. Hence the hinges, a collection of shackles and cleats that went for £6,600 and the plan of a hydroplane that found a buyer at £4.800. The auction, in a Big Top marquee next to Monaco's Royal Palace, saw 86 years



of motoring history fall under the hammer. More than 50 precious cars were on sale, fetching a grand total of £2 million. Undoubted star of the show was the two-tone blue Alfa Romeo that the great Italian racing driver, Nuvolari, drove past the chequered flag in the 1933 Le Mans 24-hour event. A supercharged 8C 2300 Cabriolet, it went to an anonymous

telephone bidder for an astonishing £275,000. Other cars that caught the eve of more than 500 buyers who jetted in from three continents were a 1948 Drophead Jaguar Mk. IV, first owned by Edmond de Rothschild: Nubar Gulbenkian's pink 1969 Mercedes 280SE, finished to his personal specification and registered in his wife's name; a couple of De Loreans (remember them?); and a fabulous white "Great Gatsby" Tourer from the early Thirties, an Isotta-Fraschini Tipo 8A, which crossed the finishing line at £155,000, and a 1923 Rolls-Royce "R" Series Silver Ghost.
