

Chatterley Whitfield Mining Museum; To the North of Stoke on Trent, deep in

England's industrial hearthland lies the Chatterley Whitfield Mining Museum.In its heyday as a colliery, Chatterley Whitfield was the largest mine in Britain and was the first to draw over one million tons of coal in a year. The pressure from industry at the time of the industrial revolution was such that hew methods of transorting coal more rapidly had to be developed. Chatterley Whitfield figured significantly as a proving ground for netechnology. So to day it is fitting that the United Kingdom 's Premier mining museum, telling a story that is intrinsically linked with transport, should be

based here.
On show at Chatterley Whitfield are examples of mining transport through the ages. Rescue vehicles, shire horses and drays, the stationary steam winding engine and seven locomotives.
