

General Presentation, This section is intended for marks for general impression and presentation, What a judge is looking for is a properly restored vehicle viewed with an 'artist's eye, does it make a good picture overall. Anything found out of place under a previous section could also lose you marks under this section because the vehicle would not look absolutely correct. At the time of juddging there should be nothing hanging from or standing in front of the vehicle, also carpets etc, on the cab or body/saloon floors will be frowed upon and marks will be lost. The overall viwe is basically of a vehicle just out of works after its first overhaul. We do not expect to see the vehicle in showrrom condition.
