ARE YOU SITTING COMFORTABLY? DO YOU HAVE SMELLING SALTS HANDY?

Well, here is a list published in Old Bike Mart recently which purports to be proposals to be put before Parliament in the next four to five years. They are:-

Owners to be prevented from working on their own cars. Work only to be executed by approved garages.

Only manufacturers, through dealerships, to sell spares.

Every vehicle to be subject to an ownership tax whether in use or not.

Cradle to Grave taxation on vehicles regardless of condition.

Local Authorities to have power to seize vehicles on private land.

Use of vehicles over 15 or 20 years old to be severely restricted with owners having to declare trips to local authorities in advance.

Vehicles over a certain age, not considered to be historic, to be compulsorily scrapped.

All vehicles, regardless of age, to be fitted with catalytic convertors.

All event organisers to be obliged to apply for planning consent.

If it wasn't for the knowledge that the FBHVC is already in dialogue with the Government and the DVLA. on the possible application of an Annual Registration Fee (Ownership tax) payable on all vehicles in use or not, then one might be tempted to think that the list was written for publication on 1st April.

That one issue of Annual Registration Fee alone does lend a degree of credence to the list and, coupled with anticipated moves connected with the need to meet the Kyoto Agreement on emissions reduction then the whole lot becomes believable. Especially bearing in mind that most people think that classic cars are old bangers, polluters, traffic jam causers etc. etc.. Classic cars might just be an easy and obvious target.

But, if it all comes to fruition (heaven forbid) how do you get spares for, or work done on, even a one year-old Rover, never mind an Armstrong Siddeley or any other true classic car?

The FBHVC will doubtless be on the case so don't all rush out now to sell your cars before the event-it mostly may never happen
