

CLASS 1 Vintage 1918-1930

- 1. 1917 Model T Ford Station Wagon. History unknown. Left hand drive version of Henry Ford's most famous product. Owned by J. Shaw, Fawkham, Kent.
- 2. 1923 Morris Cowley tourer. All original except upholstery. Regularly used by L.H. Weaver of Hailsham.
- 3. 1924 Austin 12/4 Clifton tourer. One of the oldest of this model. Very original. Owned by L.H. Weaver of Hailsham, Sussex.
- 4. 1924 Austin 7. Very early example, restored entirely by its owner who drove it down today. P. Ruff, Kempston, Beds.
- 5. 1925 3 litre Bentley. A beautiful example of this much loved and admired marque. David Llewellyn, Eastbourne.
- 6. 1925 Rolls Royce 20 h.p. A very pretty example of the best in British workmanship. David Llewellyn, Eastbourne.
- 7. 1925 Rolls Royce 20 h.p. tourer. This car was owned by R.R. and used for demonstrating during 1925. K.J. Saunders, Eastbourne.
- 8. 1926 3 litre Sunbeam. This handsome car was one of the foremost British racers of its time. W. Welch, Hastings.
- 9. 1927 Alvis 12/50. Used as a farm truck during the war, now restored and re-bodied by Brian Savill of Horam, Sussex.
- 10. 1927 Austin 12/4 Windsor. This car has been totally rebuilt by owner M. Hanson of Linton, Kent.
- 11. 1927 Lea-Francis Doctor's coupe. This is the sole surviving example of this model. S.O. Ripley, Eastbourne.
- 12. 1927 Sunbeam 20.9 Tourer. Very original and sound. 3 owners since new. M. Goodman of Patcham, Sussex.
- 13. 1928 Alvis F.W.D. A fine example of the first British car with four wheel drive. J. Eastwood of Horsmonden, Kent.
- 14. 1928 Austin 12/4 tourer. One of the most solid cars ever built. Swan Inn, Great Chart, Kent.
- 15. 1928 Austin 12/4 seater with dickey. A very pretty version of a great car. B. Thompson of Staplehurst, Kent.
- 16. 1928 Fiat 520. Imported new in chassis form and found in 1966. Since restored. G. Stanbridge, Hurstpierpoint, Sussex.

- 17. 1928 Morris Cowley Tourer. One owner until quite recently. Restored and entered by J.A. Dear of Hollingdean, Sussex.
- 18. 1929 Austin Clifton. This car brought here today by H. Court of Canvey Island, Essex.
- 19. 1929 Austin 12/4 Open road. We are lucky to have nearly the full range of vintage 12/4 models here today. Including this fine example which was finished this week! D. Thorpe, Chiddingly, Sx.
- 20. 1930 Alvis T.J.12/50. This nice 2 seater is in very original condition and is owned by G. Davis of Hove, Sussex.
- 21. 1930 Straight 8 Delage. Believed to be the only Van den Plas body on a long chassis. P. Harris, Wannock, Sussex.
- 22. 1930 Rover fabric bodied saloon. Fitted with Weymann, body of fabric stretched over ash frame. Original. F. Edenden, Ashford, Kent.

CLASS 2 Pre-War. 1931-1939 inclusive

- 23. 1931 Austin 7 Box Saloon. Found derelict on farm and restored by owner. R.J. Croker, Sedlescombe, Sussex.
- 24. 1931 Fiat 514 tourer. Not a great success for Fiat, but very welcome here. B. Thompson, Staplehurst, Kent.
- 25. 1931 Plymouth P.A. This rare car built in U.S.A. is the only one of its type in England. R. Wanmer, Hailsham, Sussex.
- 26. 1932 Morris 2 seater. Original engine. A very popular competitor of the Austin 7. C. Allchin, Mayfield, Sussex.
- 27. 1932 Triumph Super 7 Pillarless Saloon. A very lively and popular car. Owned by E. Baverstock of Chichester, Sussex.
- 60. 1933 Riley 4 seater with replica body. J. Cook, Dulwich, London.
- 28. 1933 Rolls Royce 20/25 Park Ward limousine. Chauffeur driven until 5 years ago. D. Bambridge, Pevensey Bay, Sussex.
- 29. 1933 Singer 1½ litre 6 cylinder. One of only three of this model left. T.C. Wilson, Brighton.
- 62. 1933 Talbot 105. One of Talbot's well known racing models. This example owned by P. Dalton, Pevensey, Sussex.
- 30. 1934 Austin 7 Box Saloon. Just purchased by the owner and will be restored. This is 'before'. Come back another year for 'after'. P. Kent, Ringmer, Sussex.

- 31. 1934 Austin 10. Owned and shown by G. Nicholls, Tenterden, Kent.
- 32. 1934 M.G. P.A. Owned by A.B. Russell, Barham, Kent.
- 33. 1935 AC 16/60 Used every day, recently on trip to Continent. Second in 1935 Bexhill Concours! D. Saunders, Greenwich.
- 34. 1935 Hillman Aero sports. A very pretty and lively car, in regular use. Quite rare. C. Allchin, Mayfield. Sussex.
- 35. 1935 Armstrong Siddeley sports salonn. One of the most original cars around. K. Cooke, New Romney, Kent.
- 36. 1935 Austin 10 Lichfield saloon. Rescued from breakers and restored by D. Stevens, Ashford.
- 37. 1935 Austin 7 Ruby. In process of restoration by L. Furnell of Epsom, Surrey.
- 38. 1935 Riley 9, Merlin. One of Riley's most famous models. Has twin cam engine. D. Davidson, Bognor Regis, Sussex.
- 39. 1935 Singer le Mans. A pretty car in regular use. Was used in pre-war trials. G. Rogers, Hastings.
- 40. 1936 Austin 18 York saloon. Owned by one family until last year. Now owned by C. Staden of Tunbridge Wells.
- 41. 1936 British Salmson sports. Owned by T. Llewellyn, Eastbourne.
- 42. 1937 Austin 14 Goodwood saloon. One previous owner since new. R. Thompson, Haywards Heath, Sussex.
- 43. 1938 Austin Cambridge. A previous winner here, it has done 50,000 miles since new. B. Jempson, Tenterden, Kent.
- 44. 1938 Austin Big 7. This not so common car was rebuilt by Mr. & Mrs. Dean of Tonbridge, Kent.
- 45. 1938 Austin 7 4 seater tourer. An unusual car owned and restored by Mrs. Edenden of Ashford.

CLASS 3 Post-war

- 46. 1946 MG TC Midget. Used regularly. One of the most famous small sports cars. P. Knowles, Whitstable.
- 47. 1946 MG TC Midget. This car featured in several books. Restored and owned by M. Fuller, Farnborough Park, Kent.
- 61. 1947 Triumph Roadster. Used regularly by H.C. Simpson, Whatlington.

- 48. 1948 Austin 16 saloon. Used daily to and from London by D. Thorn, Thornton Heath, Surrey.
- 49. 1948 Bentley Mk. 6. This elegant car owned by S. Giles, Canterbury.
- 50. 1948 Triumph 1800 Roadster. Hopes it will not break down on rally field as last year! P. Allen, Eastbourne.
- 51. 1949 Ford V8 Pilot. A superb product of the forties owned by H. Court of Canvey Island.
- 52. 1951 Austin A40 Devon. Austin's advanced design outdating many of its contemporaries, not many seen today. Cwned by S.G. and L.W. Fincham, Westfield, Sussex.
- 53. 1951 MG sports. Owned and restored by C. Hewson, Ninfield, Sx.
- 54. 1951 Triumph Renown. Very original example of a fine car, owned by C. Richards, Tunbridge Wells, Kent.
- 55. 1952 MG YB. A winner of several rallies and featured on T.V. J. Hanson, Seaford, Sussex.
- 56. 1952 Morris Minor. Owned by A. Griffiths of Hailsham.
- 57. 1952 Riley R.M.E. A well built car run every day by D. Thornton, of Hastings.
- 58. 1953 MG TDII. Fitted with supercharger. Owned by J. Mepsted of Staplehurst, Kent.
- 59. 1955 Morris Series 1. Owned by B. Teague, Crowborough.

CLASS 4 Commercials

- 70. 1920 Chevrolet 490. A lovely little truck, originally a car, converted during the twenties. R. Ansell, Old Romney, Kent.
- 71. 1926 Albion LC24. Very nice: 24 h.p. 4 gears and maximum speed 12 m.p.h. Restored in 1970. Owned by D. Luckett, Portchester, Hants.
- 72. 1936 Austin 7 Van. One of an Austin stable owned by M. Mason of Stourmouth, Kent.
- 73. 1943 Jeep MB. Owned and restored in authentic colours and markings by I. Millington, Hastings.

CLASS 5 Motorcycles

- 80. 1921 BSA 770 V Twin. Owned by B. Walker, Brown Bread Street, Sussex.
- 81. 1936 HRD Vincent Comet. Owned by B. Flood Thain, Hailsham.
- 82. 1949 BSA B31 350 c.c. Bought in Coventry and restored by owner. R.J. Croker, Sedlescombe, Sussex.
