

- 1. 1903 DE DION BOUTON Model R. Tonneau body Has completed 21 London - Brighton runs. S.O. Ripley, Eastbourne.
- 2. 1912 ROVER 12 h.p. 4-seater tourer Completely original, including engine and upholstery. L. Weaver, Hailsham.
- 3. 1913 MORGAN Runabout 2-seater
  This model is fitted with 964 c.c. J.A.P. air-cooled 'V' twin engine, and
  the usual two-speed chain final drive, used until 1932. Chris Booth,
  Rolvenden.

# CLASS 2

# Vintage

1919-1930 inclusive

- 4. 1924 ESSEX 'Coach' 2-door sedan
  This model is one of only three remaining, two being in America; it has had no mechanical overhauls or major restoration and was imported from New Zealand in 1979. First owner had it for 40 years until 1964 when it was sold at auction in New Zealand for £10.00. Present owner is John Luther, Hailsham.
- 5. 1924 MORRIS COWLEY 2-seater & dickey Restored by owner in 1981/82, this car travelled through Belgium, Germany, France and Switzerland in 1983 on the Morris Register's Mannekin-Pis Alpine Rally, a round trip of approx. 1,500 miles. Owner - Frank Parker, South Godstone.
- 6. 1925 VAUXHALL 30/98 Wensum Sports
  This car was for many years in an American Museum. Derek Thorpe,
  Halland, Nr. Lewes.
- 7. 1926 CITROEN B14 Torpedo Tourer Completely restored 1983/84. Owner Maurice Bailey, Orpington.
- 8. 1926 MORRIS OXFORD 4-seater tourer Restored to original condition 6 years ago. L. Weaver, Hailsham.
- 9. 1927 FORD T sedan
  One of the last of 15,000,000 model T's to leave the factory in Detroit,
  U.S.A. in May, 1927. Producted ceased in June, 1927. Monty Mason,
  Stourmouth.
- 1927 MORGAN AERO 2-seater, open body
   Jenner, Handcross.
- 11. 1927 SUNBEAM 20.9 tourer Norman Goodman, Patcham, Brighton.
- 12. 1928 JOWETT short chassis 7 h.p. 2-seater with dickey Totally restored in 1974. Owner R.C. Fenning, Bexhill.

- 13. 1928 ALVIS F.W.D. open 2-seater J. Eastwood, Horsmonden, Tonbridge.
- 14. 1928 HUMBER 14/40 Weyman body The car is original except for rear panel which owner hopes to replace with original fabric from the only other 14/40 Weymann known, which is being restored. This car is  $\underline{\text{not}}$  restored and is staying that way says owner Mike Crane, Uckfield.
- 15. 1929 AUSTIN 7 fabric saloon Found in a barn where it was being used as a hen house and restored over 8 years by owner W. Scott of Tunbridge Wells.
- 16. 1929 AUSTIN 12/4 Burnham saloon Allan Moran, Hampden Park, Eastbourne.
- 17. 1929 AUSTIN 7 works coupe One of the few survivors of only 533 made. C. May, Canterbury.
- 18. 1929 AUSTIN heavy 12open road Car was new in Eastbourne and has had only two owners. Derek Thorpe, Halland.
- 19. 1930 LAGONDA 2 litre tourer
  Originally a supercharged car bought at Dorking in 1959 in poor condition
  with engine 'blown-up'. A 1929 L.O.H. 2 litre engine was overhauled and
  fitted as a replacement. Car has been restored to present condition over
  the subsequent years. T. T. Weatherley, Hawkhurst.
- 20. 1930 M.G. 18/80 Tourer W.V. Grudgings, Folkestone.
- 21. 1930 ROVER 10/25 Weymann body Fabric body over ash frame. Francis Edenden, Ashford.

# CLASS 3 Pre-War 1931-1940 inclusive

- 22. 1931 Plymouth P.A. 4-door sedan
  One of 3 of this model sent over for the 1931 Motor Show, this car is
  the only survivor known in this country. Built in Detroit, U.S.A. Ron
  Wanmer, Hailsham.
- 23. 1932 AUSTIN 8 Box saloon
  Bill & Jean Marshall of Herne Bay have owned 'Nellie' for 22 years, during
  which time she has been in regular use, although now usually only in the
  summer.
- 24. 1932 AUSTIN 7 Box saloon RN R.E. Vickery, Folkestone.
- 25. 1932 AUSTIN 7 Box saloon RN Acquired in 1970 for £12 in a very derelect state and rebuilt over 10 years. Now in use summer and winter. John Davis, Lamberhurst.
- 26. 1932 AUSTIN 16/6 Burnham Saloon Used as a taxi until 1960, this car has since been fully restored. Mrs. B. May, Canterbury.
- 27. 1932 Hillman Minx Saloon A. T. Guy, Northiam.
- 28. 1932 MORRIS MINOR 2-door saloon C.H. Mills, St. Leonards.

29. 1932 MORRIS 10 saloon

All restoration, including upholstery done by present owner, Colin Wratten, Ashford.

- 30. 1933 M.G. J2 Midget 2-seater sports by 'Carbodies'
  In 1932 this car was road tested to 80 m.p.h. Subsequent owners discovered that a two bearing crank did not like this speed. Brian Rhead, Burgess Hill.
- 31. 1934 AUSTIN 7 Box saloon P. J. Kent, Ringmer.
- 32. 1934 AUSTIN 7 Box saloon Owned for 10 years and restored by D.G. Douch of Brighton. Used daily for the past 3 years summer and winter covering about 7000 miles a year.
- 33. 1934 M.G. 'Magna' L type continental coupe
  This car is in the final stages of a D.I.Y. rebuild which has taken nearly
  3 years since it was purchased with a bent chassis and badly damaged body
  after what must have been a major crash. Group Capt. Wyndham Welch,
  St. Leonards.
- 34. 1934 MORRIS 10/4 4-door tourer Total rebuild finished 2 years ago. Car used daily as a second car. Mr. and Mrs. T. Wilcox, Hastings.
- 35. 1934 AUSTIN Light 12/4 open road 4-seat tourer Owned by Ken Wright of Warlingham for 22 years; apart from normal maintenance and minor attention to coachwork, it is original. The hood was renewed 20 years ago.
- 36. 1935 DAIMLER 15 Mulliner Coach built saloon Originally described as a light 15, this car was supplied in 5 or 6 body styles and sold for £450 £500. Graham Bennett, Cross-in-Hand.
- 37. 1935 LANCHESTER E18 saloon Found during 1970 with a seized engine, partly dismantled and with a leaking roof, after standing outside for 7 years. Restoration took  $4\frac{1}{2}$  years. E. Noakes, Maidstone.
- 38. 1935 Singer Le Mans open sports 2-seater In the owner's family since 1958 and has been in daily use for many years. Gillian Rogers, St. Leonards.
- 39. 1936 ALVIS speed 25 tourer J. Morris, Lower Horsebridge.
- 40. 1936 AUSTIN 18 York saloon Ordered at the 1935 Motor Show and delivered in May 1936 at a cost of £328. A.J. & C.R. Staden, Tunbridge Wells.
- 41. 1936 AUSTIN 7 Ruby 4-seater Owned and restored by Mr. and Mrs. M. Oliver, Herstmonceux.
- 42. 1936 AUSTIN Ruby tourer 'Emma' was in regular use for many years by a midwife in Boughton. Restored in 1979 and owned by Mrs. J. Withers, Broadstairs,
- 43. 1936 LANCHESTER Ranalah sportsman's coupe
  This original car has a special 'one-off' body by Ranalah and has been
  in the owner's family since new. Andre Geloso, Etchingham.

- 44. 1936 M.G. Magnette 4 seat tourer Purchased in 1973 in delapidated condition and restored over 7 years by owner R.J. Croker of Sedlescombe.
- 45. 1936 MORRIS 10 saloon Mrs. P. Lovegrove, Angmering Village.
- 46. 1937 DAIMLER DB 17-1 6 Light saloon
  Off road since 1966 and stood in a barn until 1983. Now quite a rare
  car, as in 1939 a much improved 2. litre engine was fitted, which stayed
  in production until 1953. Christopher Wood, Tenterden.
- 47. 1937 AUSTIN 12 saloon P.L. Moon, Bexhill,
- 48. 1938 AUSTIN 8 tourer 'Esmerelda'. Owned by Mrs. Better Edenden, Ashford.
- 49. 1938 AUSTIN 7 Cabriolet Still running on original engine, front tyres and tubes; interior nearly all original and original hood. John Cleghorn, Folkestone.
- 50. 1938 AUSTIN Ruby saloon Just back from a 1600 mile trip to Switzerland without trouble. Melvin Edwards, Whitstable.
- 51. 1938 MORRIS Series E saloon In daily use, this car took part in a rally last year visiting Belgium, France, Germany and Switzerland. C. Butchers, Bexhill.
- 52. 1939 DAIMLER DB Cabriolet Coachwork by Salmon's, Newport Pagnall; Tickford folding head. Had been stored for a number of years before being acquired by owner G. Bennett, Cross-in-Hand.

# CLASS 4 Post-War 1941-1950 inclusive

- 53. 1945 M.G. TC 2-seater sports
  57th car off the production line; built after the end of the War. Nigel
  Davies, St. Leonards.
- 54. 1946 RILEY R.M.A. sports saloon Owned since 1948 this car has not been restored nor off the road; it is in regular use and has covered over 131,000 miles. It has appeared on T.V. D.H. Parr, Ilford.
- 55. 1946 WOLSELEY 8 saloon
  First used by Viscountess Nuffield until 1959 and passed on to Viscount
  Nuffield who used it until his death in 1963. P.L. Monn, Bexhill.
- 56. 1947 ROVER Sports 16.9 hp saloon export model Completely renovated by Edwina Ellis of Bexhill.
- 57. 1947 VAUXHALL J saloon Found in poor state and restored in 1981 by owner John Hall, Dartford.
- 58. 1948 BENTLEY SS saloon Mark VI Featured on BBC TV. Major M. Forrester, Bethersden.
- 59. 1948 WOLSELEY Series III 8 hp 4-door saloon Charles Larkin, Maidstone.

- 60. 1949 JAGUAR Mark V saloon R.A. Pointer, Hastings.
- 61. 1949 M.G. TC sports J.T. Brayley, Uckfield.
- 62. 1949 TRIUMPH ROADSTER 2000 Convertible In regular daily use for 16 years. B. Plat, East Molesey.
- 63. 1949 TRIUMPH ROADSTER 2000 sports tourer Peter Russell, Horley.
- 64. 1950 M.G. YA sports saloon
  Completely restored over the last 2 years and used all year round. All bodywork and most of the interior trim is original. Robert Chuter, Tonbridge.
- 65. 1950 M.G. TD2 2-seater tourer
  Last 'old style' M.G. First M.G. with I.F.S. and rack and pinion steering;
  most were sold in U.S.A. with a total of 30,000 built. R.B. Sawyer,
  Faversham.
- 66. 1950 MORRIS MINOR MM 2-door saloon Richard Roberts, St. Leonards.

#### CLASS 5

#### Commercials

1919-1950 inclusive

- 67. 1934 ALBION 2 axle rigid flat truck Powered by a 4 cylinder 24 hp petrol engine. This is a rare vehicle being one of 1900 supplied to the R.A.F. in 1934, some being ambulances and tankers. This example, a general purpose wooden bodied truck, was found on a farm in a very poor condition and rebuilt over 2 years. First registered November, 1980. A.W. Rigden, Romney Marsh.
- 68. 1934 BEDFORD WD truck
  Used in local antiques business for deliveries and often seen about the town. David Hance, St. Leonards.
- $69.\ 1939$  BEDFORD WS market gardener's truck M.G. Bengley, Hailsham.

70. 1918 BRADBURY

Restored by owner Pat Hewitt of Eastbourne in 1960, and in regular use during the sumer.

71. 1926 SUNBEAM 3

A rare model restored to its original specifications. A.P. Walters, Clifton-ville.

72. 1927 AJS H8 500 cc o.h.v. with 1925/26 model No. 2 Swallow sidecar Thought to be the oldest Swallow sidecar in existence; as used in the 1925 TT sidecar races. A true sporting outfit from the Vintage period which is used regularly on vintage runs and for pleasure. Bruce Ashdown, Benenden.

- 73. 1936 BSA B18
  - Rescued from a barn in a rusty heap in 1979; took 2 years to restore to its present condition. Has twice been on the annual Coventry to Brighton run and has been used on a French rally. Tom Snow, Herstmonceux.
  - 74. 1937 BSA B23 350 cc s.v. Restored over the past 18 months from a total wreck that was going to be sold as scrap. Colin Wratten, Ashford.
  - 75. 1937 BSA Empire Star M23 Owner Tim Perrin of Birchington says that this BSA looks forward to Hooe every year and it doesn't ned to look at the map any more.
  - 76. 1937 O.E.C. with AJS V twin engine 900 cc s.v. R.S. Powell, Hythe,
  - 77. 1938 Calthorpe Ivory 350 cc 1938 was the last year the Calthorpe was produced. B.Campbell, Eastbourne.
  - 78. 1939 Triumph Speed twin C. Janes, London.
  - 79. 1947 BSA C10 250 cc V. Miller, Hastings.
  - 80. 1947 NORTON Model 18 500 cc V. Miller, Hastings.
  - 81. 1949 TRIUMPH 6T V. Miller, Hastings.
  - 82. 1950 TRIUMPH Thunderbird C. Janes, London.
- 83. 1950 SUNBEAM S8 Acquired in scrap condition in 1981. Jack Widdison, Broadstairs.

#### ON DISPLAY

84. One-third scale model of 1925 Citroen Cloverleaf 3 seater This unique model was scratch built over a period of 18 months in memory of a remarkable little dog. It takes part in vintage rallies, is loved by children and has appeared in the local press on several occasions. Can be seen today on display with owner Gillian Rogers' 1935 Singer Le Mans.

85. 1922 ROLAND PILLAIN R limo

The history of this car is unknown except that it has spent many years in Batavus Museum, Heerenveen, Holland. Imported into the U.K. in 1982, purchased by owner April 1983 and restoration started (not yet complete). A.D. Sherwood, Marden Beech.

- 86. 1927 Bentley 3 litre speed Van den Plas tourer
  Originally raced in Buenos Aires for several years, winning a number of
  races one of 100 miles at an average of 85 mph on a cinder track. First
  registered in the U.K. in 1931 and has been in the same family since 1962.
  Michael Waters, Riverhead.
- 87. 1950 AC Buckland Tourer
  1 of 80 cars made by Buckland Bodies of Buntingford: only 18 remain.
  Owned by W.R. Deacon, Rye.
